

The Stephen Bufton Memorial Educational Fund (SBMEF) was created in 1953 in memory of Stephen Bufton, son of Hilary A Bufton Jr., Founder of the American Business Women's Association and his wife Ruth. Its objective is to help members and other women achieve business or professional goals through educational scholarships and grants.

Business Skills Tuition Reimbursements Program

Covers accredited courses, which might be a one-time desktop publishing course or a series of real estate licensing classes. Grants of one-half of the tuition of a course up to \$500, with chapter requirements through SBMEF.

Women in Business Magazine

Midland Chamber of Commerce
